

The Society is determined to enforce this Rule. No late entries will be accepted.

Opening times will be advertised.

Horse Classes at 9am: exhibits for the pavilion to be in place by 9am.

When restrictive conditions are attached to entries, statutory declarations will be required from every exhibitor without exception.

MEMBERSHIP PRIVILEGES

A member of the Society is entitled to free admission to the grounds for member, partner or spouse, and their children under 16 years, and may also exhibit in all classes, except where noted in the Schedule (see especially Horse Classes), without additional charge.

ADMISSION TO THE GROUND:

Non-members - \$15 Pensioners - \$10

Family Membership - \$30 **Children 16 and under - Free Entry**

ALL PAVILION ENTRIES CLOSE: WEDNESDAY 4PM, PRIOR TO SHOW DAY

HORSE ENTRIES - All horse entries to be done through **Show Day Online** and will close Wednesday 4pm, prior to Show Day

Prize money will be available from pavilion from 3:45 - 4:15pm. Prize money for Junior Sections will be issued through schools.

Any prize money not claimed on show day will be a donation to the Society.

RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor or recognised firm, and a statutory declaration of same respecting age and eligibility must be made if required.
- 2. Entries must be lodged with the Secretary, PO Box 55, Murtoa 3390 or murtoashow@hotmail. com, on or before 4pm on WEDNESDAY PRIOR TO SHOW, when a ticket will be given, stating Class, Section and Number of the Exhibit for which the entry is made.
 - (a) The Committee reserves the right of refusing or cancelling any entry stating reasons for so doing.
 - (b) All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the judge or judges appointed by the Society, and in the case of written protests, the decision of the Committee shall be accepted as final and without recourse.
 - (c) The Committee may withhold any prizes where an exhibitor, in making any entry, has made statements proved to their satisfaction to be erroneous and fraudulent, such exhibitor and his stock shall be debarred from exhibiting at the Society's Show during the pleasure of the Committee.
 - (d) Entries to the Show are accepted subject to the Rules & Regulations and Bylaws of the Society and of the Show.
 - (e) The entrant agrees to be bound by those Rules & Regulations and By-laws.
 - (f) The entrant also agrees to abide by all decisions made by the Society, by the Group with which it is affiliated or by V.A.S. Ltd. pursuant to those Rules & Regulations and Bv-laws.
 - (g) No decision so made shall be called into question by the entrant before any Court or other body (whether or not of a similar nature to a court) whatsoever.
- 3. Horse exhibitors will pay \$5 per entry and must pay a **membership of \$15** to compete, which includes entry into the Show.
- 4. No exhibitor shall be allowed to that portion of the vard in which his exhibit is placed during the adjudication (unless allowed by the Stewards), and it shall be the duty of the Stewards to prevent any person interfering with the ludges, and if necessary, order the removal of such offender from the yard.

- And no person, excepting those in charge of stock, implements and machinery, and for whom an authority must be obtained, will be permitted to remain in the yard during the adjudication, under any pretence whatsoever, the persons in charge must not leave their respective lots, nor address the ludge, unless authorised by the Stewards.
- 5. The owner or exhibitor of any exhibit disapproved of as an exhibit by the Committee of the Society must immediately upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit from the Society's ground.
- 6. The Judge or Judges may award a Second or Third prize instead of a First one, or may withhold a prize altogether, where there is no competition, or where the exhibits are not of sufficient merit.
- 7. No prizes can be awarded by the Judge or ludges for extra exhibits if the prize list contains a class or section in which the same can compete.
- 8. Should any exhibit, having gained a prize, be disqualified, the next on the list does not necessarily obtain the same prize. The Committee, with or without the advice of the ludge or ludges, shall decide the question.
- 9. No exhibit without permission from the Secretary, can be removed from the exhibition until 4pm on the day of the Show, when all exhibits can leave the yard.
- 10. Protests against awards, accompanied by the deposit of \$50, which will be forfeited if the Protest is considered frivolous, must be lodge with the Secretary, in writing, before 10am on the day after which such awards were made.
- 11. The privilege of distributing trade lists, advertisements and other documents is restricted exclusively to exhibitors at their respective stands. Any infringement of this regulation will incur expulsion from the yards.
- 12. Every possible care will be taken for all exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by the Society.
- 13. All exhibitors of stock will be required to provide their own forage, and exhibitors of machinery all fuel and material necessary to enable them to comply with the above Regulations.

- 14. The breeding year dates from 1st August for
- 15. All exhibits must be in their places on ground at appointed times.
- 16. The Committee reserves the right to postpone or alter date of the Show should same become necessary, and that the Committee incurs no responsibility or liability by reason for such postponement.
- 17. Applications for space for Trade Exhibits close Tuesday prior to the Show.
- 18. In case of disputes as to the construction of the Regulations or the meaning of anything in the prize list, the same shall be determined by the Committee of the Society, whose decision in all cases shall be final.
- 19. The Murtoa Agricultural and Pastoral Society Inc. will not be responsible for any injury or loss incurred by any entrant or competitor. Any person participating in any activity related to the Show, does so at his or her own risk.
- 20. By placing an entry, the entrant agrees not to make any claim against the Murtoa Agricultural Society for any injury or loss. The persons exhibiting agrees to compete/ exhibit at their own risk and to indemnify and keep indemnified the Murtoa Show Society against all claims, suits, actions or demands which may be brought in respect of any injury or other loss sustained by the entrant while competing at the Show. The entrant agrees to exonerate the Committee of Management of the Show Society together with any other organisation involved in the conduct of the Show from all responsibility and from all loss or injury to the exhibitor whether due to negligence or otherwise.

W.A.S.A. REGULATIONS

- 1. An article having won at a show will compete at a group Final.
- 2. An article won at a show level is not eligible for entry at any other show.
- 3. Each article entered must be a bonafide work of the exhibitor
- 4. If for any reason a winner is unable to Compete at Group level then the 2nd place getter is elegible to compete.
- 5. W.A.S.A. entrants reside in the boundries of the Wimmera Group.
- 6 Winners at W.A.S. A receive \$25 cash
- 7. Items in the following classes must be the same as won at show level. (O485, O479, Q624, Q625, Q606, Q612, M401, S846, S861)
- 8. Refer inside cover for Group Final Date.

A special thank you goes to the grounds committee for finding room for all our belongings and helping to create the temporary pavilion.







ALL EXHIBITS TO HAVE SECTION TICKET ATTACHED AND BE READY FOR JUDGING BY 9am THE PAVILION IS OPEN FROM 7.30am

Any gueries on the morning of the Show to the Pavilion Supervisor – NOT the Secretary's Office. Please check all exhibits in with the Stewards.

The pavilion will be closed to the public until judging is completed.

Any Exhibitor removing exhibits before 4.00pm will forfeit all prizes and trophies.

All entries to have entry ticket attached. Report to Stewards when delivering exhibits on Show Day.

Prize money will be available for collection on Show Day from the Pavilion, 3.45pm to 4.15pm. Aggregates: 1st, 2 points; 2nd, 1 point; Most Outstanding Exhibit, 1 point.

Where there is an equal 1st or 2nd, both competitors will be awarded 2 points or 1 point respectively. In the event of a tie in the aggregate, the competitor with the most 1st prizes will be declared the winner.

A Trophy, donated by the Schodde Family, will be awarded to the exhibitor with the highest number of points in Classes L, M, N, O, P & Q. To be won outright.

VAS COMPETITION RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1 Fach exhibit must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
- 2. Professionals are not eligible, which is defined as someone that works professionally or derives the greater percentage of their income in that craft, art form or technique.
- 3. All work is to be completed in the last twelve (12) months prior to its entry at a local show.
- 4. The competition follows the three levels of competition: Show Level, Group Level and State Level
- 5. An exhibit having won at a Show will compete at the 2026 Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final will then compete in the State Final at the 2026 Melbourne Royal Show.

- 6. An exhibitor having won at Show Level is not eligible to enter the same VAS competition at any other Show until after the Group Final judging.
- 7. An exhibitor is only eligible to represent one Group in the State Final.
- 8. If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final Level, then the second placegetter is eligibleto complete.
- 9. If an exhibitor is found to have won more than one Group Final the exhibitor mUst forfeit / reFund all prizes and will be disqualified from exhibiting for 12 months.




